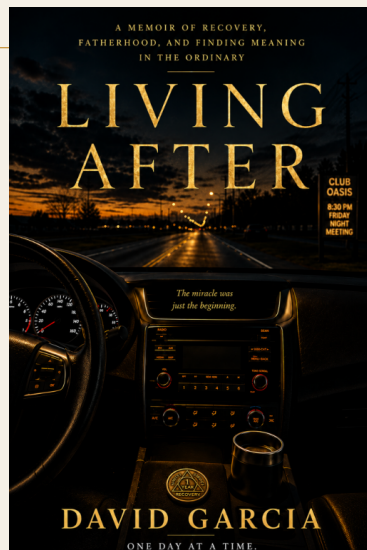
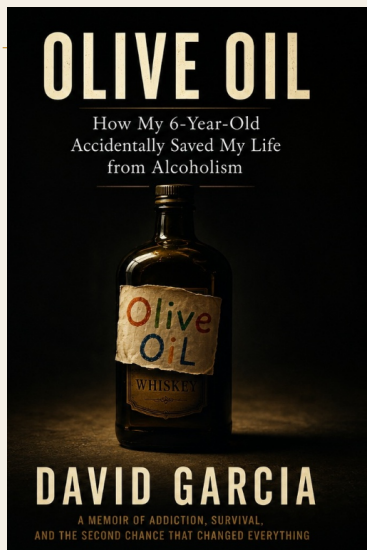

His first memoir, *Olive Oil: How My 6-Year-Old Accidentally Saved My Life from Alcoholism*, tells the deeply personal story of how his daughter became the unexpected reason he finally chose to fight for his life. His second memoir, *Living After*, continues beyond the dramatic turning point. It examines what happens when the cheering quiets down, real life returns, and the harder work begins: rebuilding trust, living with regret, rediscovering identity, and learning how to become the father his daughter deserved. David does not present recovery as easy, clean, or instantly transformative. His writing is candid, reflective, and grounded in lived experience. Through *The Becoming Whole Series*, he hopes to reach readers who need to hear that their past may explain them, but it does not have to own them. David lives in South Florida and continues to write about recovery, fatherhood, healing, and the ongoing work of becoming human again.

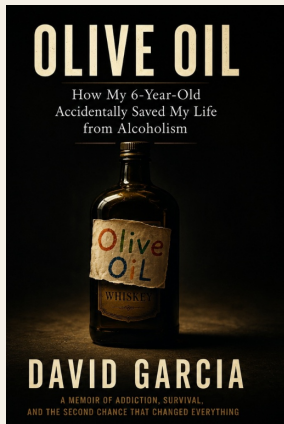
